

Notice Regarding Extension of Licenses Pursuant to Executive Order 21-22:

On April 27, 2021, Kansas Governor Laura Kelly issued Executive Order 21-22, authorizing state agencies to extend renewal deadlines for any occupational or professional license, establishment, facility, or shop license that was in good standing as of March 12, 2020, and that expired or will expire during the State of Disaster Emergency. Executive Order 21-22 allows the extension of licensing deadlines to May 28, 2021 or until the State of Disaster Emergency expires, is rescinded or terminates. In the event an agency elects not to extend the renewal deadlines, it must provide 15 days' notice through publication on the website or through other regularly used electronic communication methods.

On May 10, 2021 the Board determined that all complete renewal applications for licenses that have expired or are set to expire between March 12, 2020 and May 28, 2021 will be considered timely and no late fees will apply if received by the Board on or before May 28, 2021. This applies to all renewal periods. After May 28, 2021, even if the current order is extended through an extended disaster declaration, there will be no further license extensions. This notice serves as the required notice due 15 days prior to reinstating licensing deadlines and delinquent fees.

Any and all required continuing education due between March 12, 2020 and May 28, 2021 will also be considered timely if proof of attendance is received by the Board on or before May 28, 2021. The Board will consider a renewal application for any renewal period late and the license invalid if it is received by the Board after May 28, 2021. Delinquent fees, for each renewal period, will be applied to renewals received after May 28, 2021.

Please note that the Governor's Executive Orders did not waive renewal fees. The Order only extended the renewal deadlines and waived late fees. All renewal fees for both 2020 and 2021 are due on or before May 28, 2021.
